3. BENJAMIN³ YOUNG, SR. (WILLIAM², GEORGE¹) was born April 28, 1733 in Barbados Island, and died December 14, 1809 in Stokes Co., NC. He married ZIPPORAH GIST Abt. 1751 in Baltimore County, Md, daughter of NATHANIEL GIST and MARY HOWARD. She was born December 24, 1732 in Baltimore, MD, and died in Stokes Co., NC.

Notes for BENJAMIN YOUNG, SR.:

Ben listed as Tyndale on Dan River for the year 1751. Also Nathaniel Gist and son Christopher, and Negro Joe.

Ben exempted from poll tax by the Stokes Co. Court on November 17, 1785. Also on the same day William Southern was exempted,

He was born in Barbados and came to Baltimore at an early age. met and married Zipporah Gist in 1751. They came to the fork of Dan River and Town Fork Creek in Anson County (later Rowan, then Surry, then Stokes) and settled. Zipporah's father Nathaniel and brother Christopher were with them. They were back in Baltimore where first child Rebecca was born in 1752. Came back to Stokes and got a Granville Land Grant of 699 acres on 8/10/1762 (See The Granville District of NC 1748-1763, Vol. 3, Hoffman, page 114) The land was on the north side of the Town fork Creek and Dan River. Benjamin and Zipporah were probably the first white residents in what is now Stokes County. They built a stockade against the Indians on their land and called the place Old Town. Here he farmed, hunted, fished.
